<u>A. Introduction & Motivations of the Crusades</u> (use info. & map on resource page) 1. What city served as the motivation for the Crusades?

2. Why was this city significant to Christians, Muslims and Jews? (Be specific)

3. Who took control of the "Holy Land" in the 1000s? What did they do that upset Christians?

4. Look at the Crusades Map. List what countries/regions or civilizations (at least 5) belonged to Christian lands in the Middle Ages. <u>Also list</u> what belonged to Muslim lands.

5. Locate the city of Jerusalem. What significant body of water is it next to?

1. What groups of people joined the Crusades? (beliefs, social classes, etc.)

2. What were some motivations for people to join the Crusades? (list at least 4)

## C. The First Crusade

## Click on *first* link.

1. Why did the Byzantine Emperor call for help from Pope Urban II? \*Remember the Byzantine Empire is the Eastern half of the former Roman Empire (it did not fall).

2. **Read Pope Urban II's speech. \*Word to Know:** *Saracens = Turks* A. What was Pope Urban II's <u>main</u> message in this speech?

B. Through this speech, in what ways/reasons did the pope use to motivate Christians to join the Crusade? (**at least 3**)

C. What **bias** do you see in Pope Urban II's speech? (Think about: *How* does the pope talk about the Muslims/Turks?) \**bias* – *a perspective that favors one feeling/action/idea over others*

3. What years did the First Crusade take place? (look at the map)

4. **Describe** the challenges met by the Crusaders as they journeyed to the Middle East. Be specific.

5. When did the siege (attack) of Jerusalem begin? **Why** did the European Crusaders have difficulty attacking the city at first?

6. Who was the monk who wrote about the attack on Jerusalem? What bias might show in his account of the attack on Jerusalem?

7. What was the **result** of the First Crusade? **Be specific**! (Use the 3<sup>rd</sup> link too, to get the whole picture)
