

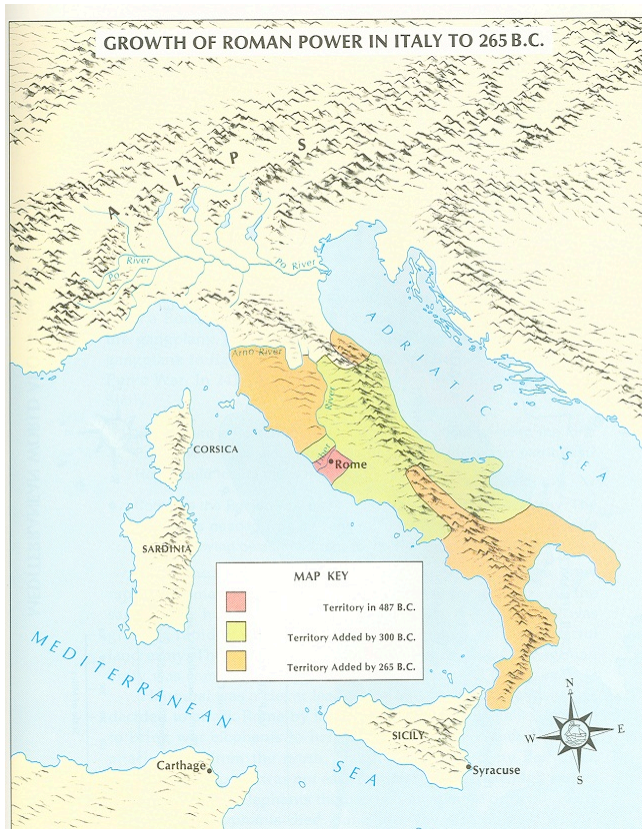
ROMAN EXPANSION

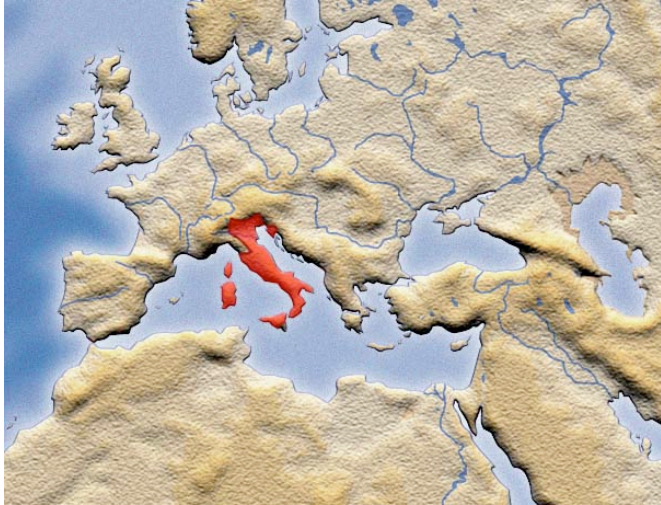


← Beginning Stages of Rome – 338 B.C.

Romans conquer the Etruscans and Greek city-states to the south of the city of Rome

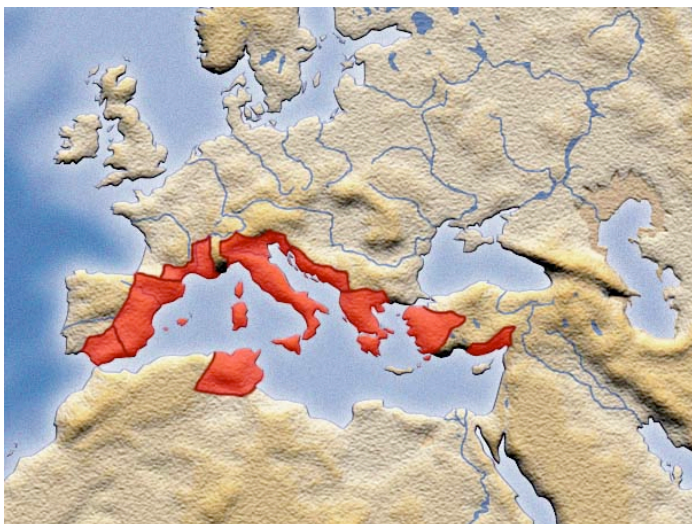


← Roman territory in 218 B.C.
